## THREE FUSD HIGH SCHOOLS NAMED AMONG STATE'S BEST IN U.S. NEWS & WORLD REPORT RANKINGS

FONTANA, CA – Three of Fontana Unified School District's five comprehensive high schools – Summit, A.B. Miller and Kaiser High Schools – rank in the best high schools in California, according to an analysis by U.S. News and World Report.


To come up with the rankings the news magazine evaluated government and private data for more than 21,500 public high schools across the country, according to its website. Schools were ranked on how each served all of their students, using performance on the math and reading parts of state proficiency tests as the benchmarks, participation and performance on Advanced Placement and International Baccalaureate exams, and the degree to which schools prepare students for college-level work.

Ranked schools are given a badge status of gold, silver or bronze depending upon the strength of their national ranking. Summit (414 in the State, 2154 nationally) was given silver medal ranking; A.B. Miller, Kaiser and Jurupa were awarded bronze medal status.

"A high school education is imperative for success in both college and a career, and a school's graduation rate is a key indicator of whether students are being effectively prepared for both paths," said Anita Narayan, managing editor of Education at U.S. News. "The 2016 Best High Schools rankings provide students and parents with data-driven information on public schools to help them make better-informed decisions about their education."

"I am proud of the commitment and dedication of our students, teachers, administrators and community that this ranking represents," said Superintendent Dr. Leslie Boozer. "It's just another indication of how far our schools have come and how they continue to raise standards and expectations for all our students."

Board President Lorena Corona agrees. "This is great news for our high schools and the community. It really shows we are on the right track."
